WELLINGTON AFC Club History

Formed in 1892 we are proud to be an FA Charter Standard Community Club. Initially the Club played in leagues based around Taunton and Tiverton. In the early 1960s it gained promotion to the Somerset Senior League and succeeded in achieving Western League status in 1978 which has been retained ever since, making the Club one of the League's longest continuously serving members.

The First Team entered the Western League in the First Division in 1978/79 season and has played at Premier Division level from 1981/82 to 1984/85 and 2008/09 to 2010/11. The team were promoted as First Division Champions at the end of the 2016/17 season. In their first season back in the Premier Division the team finished a creditable 15th, they also reached the semi-final of the Somerset Premier Cup losing 4-1 away to Southern League Paulton Rovers. The following season the team finished in 16th place and last season were struggling near the foot of the table when the season was brought to an abrupt halt by the Coronavirus Pandemic. Manager, Tim Legg has made a number of new signings for the start of the new campaign and the team are hoping to improve on last seasons performances. All other seasons were played at Division One level.

The Club's Reserve side have played in the Devon and Exeter League Division One for four seasons. Unfortunately, the team failed to finish above eighth place for three seasons and last year were in a mid-table position before the season was brought to an early close. This season the League has been reorganised and the team will play in Division One West.

Having played in the Devon and Exeter League for a number of seasons the A Team transferred to Division Three of the Taunton Saturday League for the 2018/19 season where they finished a very creditable third and gained promotion to Division Two for last season. For the forthcoming season they have been promoted to Division One as they were in topping the table when the season was forced to end.

The Club's Ladies played in the Somerset County Women's League First Division last season but found that they were unable to compete with more experienced teams. Hopefully with new players the team will improve this season.

This season the Club will again be running 21 teams in its Youth and Mini Sections. These teams see both boys and girls playing from the age of eight through to eighteen. The Club also has three Disability teams. In recent years Club Teams have had mixed fortunes in the leagues but a number have won the Sportsmanship Awards for their Age Groups and in 2018/19 season the Disability Teams won the Somerset FA Award for Disability Club of the Year.

The Club has a very successful website – www.wellingtonafc.co.uk and is makes full use of its Facebook and Twitter accounts which are very well supported.

We continue to work with the local Council's and Wellington Sports Federation on the Somerset West and Taunton Pitch Strategy which will hopefully result in the Club moving to a larger ground and bring the majority of football pitches in the town to one site.

Outside of its core footballing activities the Club is home to several darts and skittles teams and it runs a full programme of social events for members and non-members alike. TOOLSTATION WESTERN LEAGUE PREMIER DIVISION

SHEPTON MALLET 0 0 WELLINGTON

WELLINGTON bounced back from their disastrous start to the league season with a hugely-improved display at Shepton Mallet last Tuesday. Manager Tim Legg rang the changes after his side shipped seven goals at Cadbury Heath including dropping himself to the bench so he could concentrate on coaching the side. He also welcomed back central defender Jordan Casey and midfielder James Clough, who were both outstanding in a wholehearted performance by the entire team.

Playing up the slope, Shepton had the better openings early on although Wellington almost went ahead from their first chance after 22 minutes when the ball was presented to Jesse Howe in a good position but he skied his shot.

It remained goalless until half-time and, after the break, it was the visitors' turn to look more dangerous. Jason Quick saw a fierce free-kick cannon back off the keeper with the rebound put over the bar by Clough, who then volleyed across goal with no-one able to get the vital touch. Shortly afterwards, Harry Walford had a teasing cross hooked away by a defender before Mason Raymond shot just wide.

At the other end, Shepton came closest to breaking the deadlock seven minutes from time as a cross from the right was met with a powerful header which keeper Chandler Hallett pushed up on to the underside of the bar.

The home side were reduced to ten men for the closing minutes with a defender sin-binned for his comments to the officials and, although Wellington had a penalty appeal for handball turned down, they couldn't make the advantage count.

A draw was probably the right result from an entertaining encounter between two sides who both tried to play football without being able to produce the final finish.

BRADFORD TOWN 1 1 WELLINGTON

Our first team collected their second successive away point with another gutsy display at Bradford Town.

After a disastrous 7-3 defeat by Cadbury Heath in their opening league game, Tim Legg's new-look squad have re-grouped and are now showing encouraging signs for the rest of the season.

Kick-off in Wiltshire was delayed by 30 minutes after Wellington and the match officials were delayed by a motorway accident but that didn't stop the game getting off to an action-packed start.

Bradford hit the bar inside the first minute and then took the lead shortly afterwards with a huge slice of luck. The ball was driven low into the visitors' box and a clearance smashed into Mason Raymond's face and back past helpless keeper Chandler Hallett for the most unfortunate of own goals.


However, it was Wellington who then got lucky with their equaliser after 16 minutes as their first corner was played up into the air and goalwards where Bradford keeper Marko Radovanovic spilled the over his own line.

Bradford hit the bar again while, at the other end, Raymond and Miles Quick drove wide of the target as it finished level at the break.

Both sides pressed for the winner in the second half with the home side seeing a 'goal' disallowed for offside and Radovanovic making amends for his earlier blunder with a fine save from Jesse Howe's free-kick.

As at Shepton Mallet, a draw was the fair result and Wellington can now look forward to a local derby this evening for their first home league game of the season.

TONIGHT'S VISITORS BRIDGWATER TOWN

We extend a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Bridgwater Town for this evening's Toolstation Western League Premier Division fixture.

A Brief History of Senior Football in Bridgwater

Background

Early attempts to establish a senior association football club in the rugby stronghold of Bridgwater failed to attract supporters, were beset with financial woes and were thus short-lived.

It was not until after the Second World War that solid foundations for a club were finally laid. A group of enthusiasts formed **Crown Dynamo FC** in 1946 based at a public house in St John Street. The team quickly gained a substantial following and became the forerunner of **Bridgwater Town AFC**. The purchase of land off Bristol Road for a home ground, the backing of a large supporters' organisation and the support of prominent local businessmen, who became directors enabled the club to flourish.

Soon the club owned a portfolio of residential property and was able to offer a house, a job and a good part-time wage to prospective footballers. This enabled the club to attract many ex-Football League professionals and field strong, competitive teams, which enjoyed great success as one of the Western League's leading sides.

Two Western League championship mantles, cup final wins and thrilling runs in the FA Cup and FA Trophy were experienced throughout the 1960's, 70's and 80's.

In 1982 Bridgwater Town became members Southern League. It all came to an abrupt end in June 1984 when substantial debts forced to club into voluntary liquidation.

The Current Club

A new club, **Bridgwater Town (1984) FC** was quickly established by a band of loyal supporters and from humble beginnings worked all the way back up from Somerset County League origins to attaining Southern League membership inside a twenty-three year timespan.

On the way the club enjoyed a hat trick of Somerset County Premier titles, a Screwfix Western League Division 1 championship and two Les Philips Cup Final wins. As members of the Southern League they reached the Final of the Southern League Cup (2009) and were beaten finalists in the promotion play-offs (2010). However after 2010 leaner times returned, eventually leading to relegation in 2017.

Now, again playing Step 5 level, the club remains ambitious and after a short period of consolidation, aims to compete strongly for the title and regain its previous status.

EXTRACT FROM TOOLSTATION BULLETIN 12TH SEPTEMBER 2020



FA Cup: Bitton's frantic start to the season continued on Saturday, after they overturned a two-goal deficit to beat **Bridgwater** 3-2 at Fairfax Park. The home side looked to be in the ascendancy after 20 minutes when goals from Tom Ellis and Mike Duffy put them two goals to the good. Bitton get themselves hope at the beginning of the second half when Liam Bishop smashed the ball home, and they were soon back on level terms when Joe McLennan produced a fine curling effort from outside the box less than two minutes later. The game's deciding goal came with just over 20 minutes left on the clock, when Ashley Kington's pin-point free kick found the back of the net to help Bitton complete the unlikely turnaround. **Clevedon** also produced a fightback to book their spot in the next round, scoring twice in the final half hour to beat **Sherborne** 2-1. The First Division outfit took the lead ten minutes into the second half, when Ashley Clarke headed home a corner, with Clevedon responding with a set-piece goal of their own which was finished well by Glen Hayer. That set up an entertaining finish, and it was the away side who provided a moment of magic to secure the win, with Finlay Biggs picking the ball up in his own half before curling home an unstoppable effort to break Zebra hearts. A couple of Sherborne's adversaries were also knocked out at the second hurdle, with **Wells City** falling to a 3-0 defeat away at **Bideford**, while **Corsham** were beaten 2-0 by **Winchester Town** of the Southern League.

Shepton Mallet produced an excellent performance to beat **Willand Rovers** 1-0 in a result which should boost their confidence following a couple of draws in the league so far. Keeping their opponents scoreless will have been one of the most pleasing aspects of the result, with the decisive goal coming 18 minutes from time when Asa White slotted home a brilliant free-kick to dispatch the Devon side. Other sides from that county enjoyed mixed fortunes in their ties, with Tyler Elliot among the scorers in **Tavistock's** 2-1 victory over the higher-ranked **Mangotsfield**, while **Exmouth** suffered a 2-0 defeat at home to **Melksham**. Early goals seem to be a pattern for **Cribbs** in the FA Cup season, and after seeing off Newent in the previous round, a goal inside five minutes on Saturday was the catalyst for their 2-0 victory over **Berkhampstead** in the preliminary round. It was Steve Murray who notched soon after 3pm on Saturday to put Cribbs in front, and after

maintaining their clean sheet throughout, a late second for Matt Spiller capped an outstanding afternoon for the Bristol side. At Springfield, **Cadbury Heath** could not maintain the lead which Matt Huxley's header afforded them, eventually suffering a 5-1 defeat at home to **Bristol Manor Farm**

Premier Division: Plymouth Parkway sit pretty with nine points from nine atop the league after beating **Chipping Sodbury Town** 4-0 on Saturday afternoon. Having held out for the majority of the first half, Chipping Sodbury's defence were finally broken down in the 43rd minute when a towering header at the back post from Jordan Bentley put the Devon side in front. Two goals in the space of five minutes from brothers Mike and Levi Landricombe made it 3-0 midway through the second half, before Ryan Richards added a late fourth for Parkway. Another side who have made a strong start to the season are **Street**, and they struck four times after the break to beat **Roman Glass St George** 5-1 at The Tannery Ground. Having fallen behind in the 20th minute to Sandro Costanza's well-taken opener, Roman Glass got themselves level at the interval when Liam Harding laid on an assist for Ben Bament. Street took no time at all in asserting themselves at the beginning of the second half, with quick-fire goals from Ed Butcher and Oscar Latas making it 3-1 within five minutes of the restart. An unfortunate own goal from Harding extended Street's advantage further, before Kyle Strange added the finishing touches to their big win in the closing stages. **Westbury United** joined Street on seven points, after a Dan Price goal midway through the first half helped them edge to a 1-0 victory at home to **Odd Down**. Ryan Bush goals either side of the interval saw **Buckland Athletic** secure a 2-1 win over **Keynsham Town** at Homers Heath. Bush struck a lovely volley in first half stoppage time to break the deadlock, before doubling the hosts advantage in the opening five minutes of the second half. Keynsham hit back through Craig Wilson to set up an entertaining second half, and just when it looked like Bush would cap the victory with a hat-trick, he saw his 78th minute penalty saved. In a game delayed due to travel issues, **Bradford Town** and **Wellington** both remain winless in the league following a 1-1 draw at Trowbridge Road. The hosts started well, and after hitting the crossbar inside the opening minute, they went ahead a couple of moments later when Luke Burman's cross ricocheted into the back of the visitors net off a Tangerine defender. Wellington responded well however, and after earning a corner, Bobcat keeper Marko Radovanovic was pressurised into making a mistake and ended up seeing the ball inadvertently end up in his own net to make it one apiece. There was a stalemate in the fixture between **Brislington** and **Hallen** at the Poplar Insulation Stadium, where the home side ended the game with nine men



WESTERN LEAGUE ISSUES MESSAGE TO FANS: LETS KEEP PLAYING, KEEP WATCHING AND FOLLOW THE GUIDANCE

The Toolstation Western League is asking fans to support their local football clubs on and off the field this season by observing the Covid-19 guidance.
