WELLINGTON AFC Club History

Formed in 1892, we are proud to be an FA Accredited Club. Initially, the club played in leagues based around Taunton and Tiverton. In the early 1960s, we gained promotion to the Somerset Senior League and succeeded in achieving Western League status in 1978 which has been retained ever since, making us one of the league's longest continuously-serving members.

The First Team entered the Western League in the First Division in the 1978-79 season and played at Premier Division level from 1981-82 to 1984-85 and 2008-09 to 2010-11. The team were then promoted as First Division Champions at the end of the 2016-17 season. In their first season back in the Premier Division, the team finished a creditable 15th and also reached the semi-final of the Somerset Premier Cup losing 4-1 away to Southern League club Paulton Rovers. The following season, the team finished in 16th place but unfortunately, the next two campaigns were brought to an early conclusion by the Coronavirus pandemic.

Last season provided new challenges for the team, including starting the season with a trip to Mousehole and a final match at Helston on Easter Monday. The side achieved their highest position in the Toolstation Premier League since the 2009-10 season (14th) and equaled the club's longest run in the FA Vase (third round). The 2022-23 season again presents new challenges and new grounds to visit with teams being promoted to and relegated into the Premier Division. Joint managers Tim Legg and Alex Pope are again in charge of the side.

The Reserves were top of Division One West in the Devon and Exeter League when the 2020-21 season was terminated due to the Covid pandemic. The league took the opportunity to restructure for the start of the 2021-22 season and move away from the East and West Divisions and, as a result, the Reserves were placed in Division One where they finished in fifth place. Although there has been some movement of teams within the league the Reserves, under new manager, Nick Buttle, have remained in Division One for this season.

Having played in the Devon and Exeter League for a number of seasons, the A team transferred to Division Three of the Taunton Saturday League for the 2018-19 season when they finished a creditable third, gaining promotion to

Division Two for the 2019-20 season. They gained further promotion to Division One for the 2020-21 season and were topping the table when the season was forced to end due to the Covid pandemic. They won their group in the league's Covid Cup and also won the Seward Cup held over from 2019-20. Last season they finished in fifth place and, under manager Warren Toth, are in Division One again this for this campaign.

The club's Ladies played in the Somerset County Women's League Division Two (Flexi) in the 2020-21 season, finishing a creditable third when the season resumed. Last season they again played in Division Two where they finished in second place and reached the quarter-finals of the League Knock-Out Cup. Under manager Nyima Touray, they have been promoted to Division One for the 2022-23 campaign. This season there is also an additional Ladies Development Team, giving the opportunity for players to progress from the Wildcats Under 16s to senior football.

Last season, our youth teams once again performed well in their respective league and cup competitions, notably the Under 14s Town won their division and were runners-up in the league cup while the Under 12s United and Under 15s Town teams both finished runners-up in their division. All the other youth teams, boys and an increasing number of girls, acquitted themselves well and continue to be run by a small army of enthusiastic volunteers.

Our three Disability teams also performed well in their league and, this season, instead of three adult teams, we have two adult teams and a youth team.

In total this season, the club are running no fewer than 33 teams.

We continue to work with the town and district councils to pursue the club's attempts to establish a new First Team facility on land on the new Longforth Farm Estate on the edge of the town. This would then free-up the Playing Field for other teams to use. We are also working with the Wellington Sports Federation on the Somerset West and Taunton Playing Pitch Strategy regarding other land in the town where it is proposed a number of youth sports pitches would be provided.

Outside our core footballing activities, Wellington AFC is home to several darts and skittles teams and we run a full programme of social events for members and non-members alike with the impressive Function Room and Lounge available for hire.

MATCH REPORT BITTON 1 2 WELLINGTON

Wellington bounced back from two defeats in four days with a hard-earned victory away to struggling Bitton in Bristol last Saturday.

The Tangerines had lost 2-1 to Clevedon Town in the league followed by a 3-2 Somerset Premier Cup defeat away to Frome Town. And they had to dig deep to beat a side propping up the table with only one point from ten games.

The game was never a classic with both teams struggling to find any sort of cohesion. It was Bitton who came closest to taking the lead after 14 minutes when striker Jamal Cuevelleau's shot smacked against the underside of the bar.

The first half was a scrappy affair, but Wellington broke the deadlock as it was about to enter a lengthy period of injury time. Stefan Phillips lofted a high ball into the home box and midfielder Sam Towler rose to score with a well-placed downward header.

The Tangerines nearly doubled their lead six minutes after the restart but Tom Stone's goal bound header was hooked off the line - the defender had suffered a similar fate late on against Frome.

However, the visitors were not to be denied and did make it 2-0 with 20 minutes remaining. Jason Quick floated over a free kick and 16-year-old Kelson Pollard - the smallest player on the pitch - headed home his first goal for the club.

That looked like game over but Bitton produced a late rally, pulling a goal back with six minutes remaining as skipper Jordan Williams powered forward to drive home an unstoppable shot.

That meant an anxious end to the game for Wellington, but they held firm for three valuable points.



TODAY'S VISITORS SHERBORNE TOWN

We extend a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Sherborne Town for today's Toolstation League Premier Division game.

The club was officially founded in 1894, making them one of the oldest clubs in Dorset, but evidence has recently come to light that Sherborne had a football team playing friendly matches in 1888 with a match report from 7th January 1888 losing 4-0 against the Volunteers. The club played their friendly matches in those early days at Marston Road, on the outskirts of the town, during this time the Dorset Football League was founded in the 1896/97 season.

The club joined local leagues and entered local charity cup competitions the club they later joined the County league. Originally playing at the Terrace playing fields, the club then moved across the road in 1985 to its present home, Raleigh Grove, referencing Sir Walter Raleigh's historical connection with the town. The Raleigh Grove site was built on a grazing field which had to be levelled, to create a playing area, a task made all the more difficult as there was a pond in the far right corner of the ground. The new ground was built to standards laid down for promotion from the Dorset Premier league at the time and was somewhat ahead of its time with the Clubhouse incorporating the dressing rooms, bar, function room, kitchen, storeroom and toilets, including disabled facilities.

The record attendance at the ground is 1,000 versus Eastleigh (featuring ex-Southampton and England international Matthew Le Tissier), in the Andy Shephard Memorial match on July 27th 2003. Four Football League clubs have played at Raleigh Grove: Plymouth Argyle, Torquay United, Swindon Town and Yeovil Town. In 2001 the committee at Sherborne Town FC outlined a three-phase, five-year plan for the future development of the ground. By 2004 a hard standing, a grandstand, new dugouts and floodlights erected and working had been completed.

Then manager Martyn Starnes stepped up from his position of youth team manager to first team manager and was the catalyst for gradual rise to achieving Western League football. Martyn led the team finishing in the top six of the Dorset Premier League for five seasons running, leading to the long battle to convince the league officials of the club's determination to join the south west's premier football league. In the season 2003/4, the club finished in fourth and also won the Dorset Senior County Cup. An application was made to the Western League but the Dorset Premier League refused to grant consent.

However, with the last game of the 2005-6 season Sherborne produced an excellent performance to beat Bridport Reserves 2-0 away to secure the runners-up position, and days later the news broke that the club had at last been accepted into the Western League. The first campaign in the Western League First Division proved one of consolidation, before earning promotion as runners-up to Wellington the next season under the guidance of Kevin Leigh. In January 2007 the club played an historic FA Vase tie at Mildenhall Town in Suffolk in the last 32 of the competition.

Despite the club securing mid-table safety largely thanks to a 13-game unbeaten run. Kev stepped down in August 2009 and replaced by former Yeovil Town striker Mickey Spencer. Relegation was avoided on the last day of the season. On Saturday 25 September 2010 Sherborne played arguably the biggest game of their 133-year history as they hosted Hungerford Town in the FA Cup Second Round Qualifying - the furthest they have ever reached in the competition. Spencer left the club in November 2011 and was succeeded by player turned manager Jamie Manley. Despite a strong push towards the end of the season, the club was relegated to the First Division by the smallest of margins.

The 2012/13 season saw Sherborne return to the Premier League at the first time of asking and as First Division Champions; Jamie Manley built a championship winning team for the first time in 31 years. At the end of the season, the club secured substantial funding from The Football Stadia Improvement Fund, Viridor Credits Environmental Company, Sherborne Town Council and West Dorset District Council to improve the clubhouse facilities and renovate the pitch. Ex Sheffield United, Yeovil Town and Weymouth midfielder Gerry Pearson was installed as the 1st team manager for the 2016/17 season. Gerry worked tirelessly to preserve the clubs Premier League status but unfortunately, the club was relegated at the end of the season.

Wayne Jerome took over the hot seat in 2018 and has built a very competitive team turning the club's fortunes around, cumulating in a 2nd and promotion position in the COVID 19 season of 2019/20 which was deemed null and void. The following season saw the season abandoned yet again in March 2021 due to the pandemic. During 2021/22 season Wayne let a fantastic campaign which secured the first division title mainly due to a club record 21 game winning run and collecting 99 points.

The club are excited to enter a new phase in their history joining the Toolstation Western League Premier League which will see the club traveling the entire length of the south west peninsular from Bristol to Cornwall, the reward for promotion ensures FA Cup and FA Vase entry





EXTRACT FROM TOOLSTATION BULLETIN 20TH MARCH 2022



Premier Division: With league leaders Bridgwater out of action on Saturday afternoon, Saltash trimmed their lead to eight points thanks to a convincing 4-1 win at home to Ashton & Backwell United. Having joined teammate Callum O'Brien in celebrating their 200th appearances for the Ashes prior to kickoff, Dave Barker marked the occasion with a goal in either half to help propel the hosts to victory. It was Callum Martindale who got the ball rolling after just three minutes, with Barker restoring Saltash's lead in first half stoppage time after Shea Bennington-Mannings had drawn Ashton level. Adam Carter then helped build a two-goal advantage, before Barker put a cap on the performance 20 minutes from time. In another clash to take place in Cornwall, Shepton Mallet fell to a surprise defeat at the hands of Falmouth. After firing off eight consecutive victories to start the season, Mallet have now lost two on the bounce, after a superb header from Scott Kellow early in the second half handed Falmouth all three points. **Buckland**'s excellent run of form shows no signs of slowing, with a late surge helping them defeat **Helston** 4-0 at Homers Heath (pictured left, courtesy of John Pool). Having struck a hat-trick seven days previously, Ryan Bush was among the goals again for Buckland, opening the scoring after half an hour to give the Bucks a deserved lead. Josh Webber then struck twice in the space of seven second-half minutes to put the result beyond doubt, with Scott Crocker adding some gloss to the scoreline when he added a fourth in stoppage time.

Clevedon Town hit back to beat Street 2-1, moving into the top half thanks to back-to-back league wins.
