WELLINGTON AFC Club History

Formed in 1892, we are proud to be an FA Accredited Club. Initially, the club played in leagues based around Taunton and Tiverton. In the early 1960s, we gained promotion to the Somerset Senior League and succeeded in achieving Western League status in 1978 which has been retained ever since, making us one of the league's longest continuously-serving members.

The First Team entered the Western League in the First Division in the 1978-79 season and played at Premier Division level from 1981-82 to 1984-85 and 2008-09 to 2010-11. The team were then promoted as First Division Champions at the end of the 2016-17 season. In their first season back in the Premier Division, the team finished a creditable 15th and also reached the semi-final of the Somerset Premier Cup losing 4-1 away to Southern League club Paulton Rovers. The following season, the team finished in 16th place but unfortunately, the next two campaigns were brought to an early conclusion by the Coronavirus pandemic.

Last season provided new challenges for the team, including starting the season with a trip to Mousehole and a final match at Helston on Easter Monday. The side achieved their highest position in the Toolstation Premier League since the 2009-10 season (14th) and equaled the club's longest run in the FA Vase (third round). The 2022-23 season again presents new challenges and new grounds to visit with teams being promoted to and relegated into the Premier Division. Joint managers Tim Legg and Alex Pope are again in charge of the side.

The Reserves were top of Division One West in the Devon and Exeter League when the 2020-21 season was terminated due to the Covid pandemic. The league took the opportunity to restructure for the start of the 2021-22 season and move away from the East and West Divisions and, as a result, the Reserves were placed in Division One where they finished in fifth place. Although there has been some movement of teams within the league the Reserves, under new manager, Nick Buttle, have remained in Division One for this season.

Having played in the Devon and Exeter League for a number of seasons, the A team transferred to Division Three of the Taunton Saturday League for the 2018-19 season when they finished a creditable third, gaining promotion to

Division Two for the 2019-20 season. They gained further promotion to Division One for the 2020-21 season and were topping the table when the season was forced to end due to the Covid pandemic. They won their group in the league's Covid Cup and also won the Seward Cup held over from 2019-20. Last season they finished in fifth place and, under manager Warren Toth, are in Division One again this for this campaign.

The club's Ladies played in the Somerset County Women's League Division Two (Flexi) in the 2020-21 season, finishing a creditable third when the season resumed. Last season they again played in Division Two where they finished in second place and reached the quarter-finals of the League Knock-Out Cup. Under manager Nyima Touray, they have been promoted to Division One for the 2022-23 campaign. This season there is also an additional Ladies Development Team, giving the opportunity for players to progress from the Wildcats Under 16s to senior football.

Last season, our youth teams once again performed well in their respective league and cup competitions, notably the Under 14s Town won their division and were runners-up in the league cup while the Under 12s United and Under 15s Town teams both finished runners-up in their division. All the other youth teams, boys and an increasing number of girls, acquitted themselves well and continue to be run by a small army of enthusiastic volunteers.

Our three Disability teams also performed well in their league and, this season, instead of three adult teams, we have two adult teams and a youth team.

In total this season, the club are running no fewer than 33 teams.

We continue to work with the town and district councils to pursue the club's attempts to establish a new First Team facility on land on the new Longforth Farm Estate on the edge of the town. This would then free-up the Playing Field for other teams to use. We are also working with the Wellington Sports Federation on the Somerset West and Taunton Playing Pitch Strategy regarding other land in the town where it is proposed a number of youth sports pitches would be provided.

Outside our core footballing activities, Wellington AFC is home to several darts and skittles teams and we run a full programme of social events for members and non-members alike with the impressive Function Room and Lounge available for hire.

Wellington took their second point off leaders Bridgwater as they extended their unbeaten run at the Playing Field last Saturday.

After ending the visitors' 100 per cent record with a goalless draw at Fairfax Park last month, the Tangerines again proved that, on their day, they can match any team in the league.

The result was also achieved with a changed line-up, with all three Quick brothers along with Glen Wright, unavailable but their replacements all acquitted themselves with distinction.

It was a tale of two keepers with Harley Wilkinson in the home goal and Jake Viney, against his former club, both in outstanding form.

The game got off to an exciting start with two goals in the opening six minutes. Jordan Greenwood headed Bridgwater in front from a corner before Wellington drew level with a penalty as Eli Collins was sent tumbling in the box and skipper Sam Towler made no mistake from the spot.

It was still goalless at the end of an entertaining first half with Tom Stone seeing a header cleared off the line and, at the other end, Wilkinson pulling off a superb reaction save to deny Greenwood.

Bridgwater had the perfect chance to regain the lead when they were awarded a penalty of their own for a foul on Jake Brown after 63 minutes. Jake Llewellyn struck the kick well enough, but Wilkinson flung himself to pull off a brilliant save.

The longer the game went on, the more frustrated Bridgwater became, culminating in Greenwood being sent to the sin bin in the closing stages. Indeed, it was Wellington who looked more likely to snatch the winner with a succession of efforts on goal including a brilliant double save by Viney.

MATCH REPORT TOOLSTATION WESTERN LEAGUE – PREMIER DIVISION SHEPTON MALLET 4 3 WELLINGTON

A dramatic finale saw Wellington's unbeaten run ended away to third-placed Shepton Mallet last night (Tuesday).

When skipper Sam Towler converted an injury-time penalty, it looked like the Tangerines would be heading home with a point. But the referee added on nine minutes in total and there was still time for Shepton to snatch a hotly disputed winner.

Wellington welcomed back the three Quick brothers – all missing for Saturday's draw with leaders Bridgwater United – and it was Miles who opened the scoring with what has to be one of the fastest goals in the club's history.

The visitors kicked off up the slope, strung a series of passes together and, when a Shepton defender missed the low cross, Miles Quick pounced to shoot high into the net with the referee confirming only 28 seconds on the clock. The home side hadn't even touched the ball but picked themselves up to boss the rest of the game without being able to shake off their opponents.

Shepton pulled a goal back after 17 minutes when the ball was pulled back to Joe Morgan who drove an unstoppable shot past keeper Harley Wilkinson.

It remained 1-1 until the break but Wellington got off to the worst possible start to the second half, falling behind only three minutes after the restart. A ball into the box reached the unmarked Dec Cornish and, although the outstanding Wilkinson saved well, the ball was scrambled over the line by Josh Jenkins.

Wellington refused to lie down and drew level just after the hour mark when Jamie Nicholson's shot came back off the inside of the post and Miles Quick smashed home the rebound.

The visitors' joy was short-lived, however, with Shepton regaining their lead within four minutes. A corner was floated over from the left and defender Callum Ball rose at the far post to head home.

With the hosts looking more dangerous, it seemed that might be game over, but Wellington almost made it 3-3 five minutes from time with keeper Tom Easterbrook pulling off a superb double save from Jake Quick and then Sully McKenna.

The Tangerines refused to be denied and, two minutes into stoppage time, Jake Quick ran on to a long ball only to be brought down as he rounded Easterbrook. Towler, so reliable from the penalty spot these days, clinically dispatched the kick for another equaliser.

Everyone thought that would be it but the referee played seven more minutes with Shepton regaining their lead in controversial circumstances shortly before the final whistle eventually blew. A free kick was headed across goal and turned over the line by Matt Wood. Wellington claimed vehemently that the scorer was offside and central defender Tom Stone was shown a red card for his protests.

TODAY'S VISITORS KEYNSHAM TOWN

We extend a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Keynsham Town for today's Toolstation League Premier Division game.

Keynsham Town Football Club is over 120 years old, having been formed in 1896. In the early days it played at the "Hams" and then moved to "Gaston" in 1910. 1n 1925 the club played in Park Road and then moved again in 1930 to a pitch on Charlton Road. All these grounds have now been built on and there is no evidence of them.

In 1939 the club was disbanded for the duration of the Second World War and was reformed in 1945 when the club found its new home at Crown Fields, where it has played ever since. It was due to the foresight of Roy Neal and Ken Dowling and the Committee at that time that the ground is left in trust to ensure that football can be played for the generations to come. The main clubhouse was built in the 1970's with new dressing rooms added in 1984 and floodlights in 1989. In recent years the clubhouse has been upgraded and most recently the seats have been replaced, incidentally from the old Williams Stand at Ashton Gate, home of Bristol City Football Club.

The club first played in the Bristol & District League and progressed to the Bristol Premier Combination. The club then moved into the Somerset County League and into the Western League in 1974. The club then found themselves in the first division of the Western League when that league was formed in season 1975/6 but returned to the Premiership in 1978/9 when Town finished as champions and then spent 5 years at the higher level only to find themselves in Division 1 for the start of season 1983/4. The Town then had a barren spell and it did not return to the top flight until 1997, finishing runners up to Melksham Town but the yoyo affect kicked in again two seasons later when the Town again returned to Division 1 only to return again in 2000 finishing runners up to Team Bath. After brief flirtations with the Premier Division in the mid-2000s, the Ks have been in Division 1 for several seasons now.

Fortunes took a turn for the better when Chris King and Sean Day took over management duties in September 2014. Their first full season in charge, assisted by coach Russell Holt, saw the club finish within 10 points of the Division 1

winners. Then 2016-17 saw Keynsham's best season for 15 years as we narrowly missed out on promotion, despite amassing 81 points.

Chris and Sean both decided to step down from their roles in May 2017, but the club were fortunate enough to procure the services of John Allen from Wells City. John was a key figure in Wells' promotion and Somerset Premier Cup double in 2015-16. Russ Holt stayed on and became John's Assistant Manager.

After agonisingly amassing an excellent 89 points but only finishing third in 2017-18, the club cemented all the hard work both on and off the pitch by storming to the Division One championship in 2018-19. A run of 24 wins from the last 26 games saw the Ks accrue 93 points and comfortably win the title by 9 points. This season sees the Ks back in the Premier Division for the first time since the 2006-07 season.

Away from the first team the Town were developing their football club with the introduction of a reserve side in 1987, who also won promotion to the Premier Division of the Somerset County League last season. The most noticeable achievement was the winning of the Somerset Senior Cup in 2003, the first time in 45 years, beating Westlands at Clevedon's Hand Stadium.

In 1988 an Under 18 Youth team was formed, competing in the Somerset Floodlight Youth League. In 2006/7 they were promoted to the First Division of this league and to complete the circle an "A" team was formed in 1993 to compete in the Bath & District League; they are now in the Bristol & Suburban League. Both these sides were formed to support the growing number of players from within the Club's successful youth section and to provide that important step between junior and adult football.

The Town's junior section has several sides playing competitive football on a regular basis. The club sees the progress of its junior club as the keystone to the club's future development and playing success of the senior club with the sights set firmly on the local community for its inspiration and future success. With all the teams within the Town family, including the Ladies' teams covered later in the programme, we have over 25 teams playing regularly for the Club. With a club of such size and diversity, it is an honour to be designated as a Community Development Club, the highest level of the FA's Charter Standard initiative, something the club treasures and has set its stall out to operate under the ethos of the Charter.



<u>Premier Division:</u> League leaders **Bridgwater United** were denied maximum points by **Wellington** for the second time this season after they were held to a 1-1 draw in Somerset. Despite taking an early lead through Jordan Greenwood, Bridgy were pegged back soon after when Sam Towler levelled from the spot. United were then afforded the perfect opportunity to go back ahead, but Wellington keeper Harley Wilkinson denied Jake Llewellyn's penalty attempt and the game finished one apiece

Saltash are now level on points atop the division following a dramatic 3-2 win over Street. After surging ahead through Fletcher Williams, the Ashes were then hit by a double-blow midway through the second half and found themselves facing a shock defeat. United got the equaliser their pressure warranted ten from time through Sam Hughes, and it was then the same man who struck again in the 88th minute, hitting an incredible milestone, with his 300th goal for the club handing them the victory. Clevedon did manage to pull a goal back 20 minutes from time through Nathan Groom, before Josiah McKayle eased any nerves for the home fans by scoring his side's third just prior to the game reaching the 90-minute mark. The biggest scorers of the day were **Mousehole**, who continued their ascendancy

up the division by winning 6-2 away at **Barnstaple**. A pair of early strikes from Hayden Turner set Mousehole on their way, before the dynamic forward joined opponent Dave Slade in having an early shower when both were dismissed towards the end of the first half for different incidents. The points were also split at Falmouth, where visitors Keynsham came from two down to grab an encouraging 2-2 draw. Efforts from Jack Webber and Jack Bray-Evans at the beginning of either half put Falmouth in command, before Owen Brain spearheaded Keynsham's fightback, scoring twice in the final 26 minutes to end their long run of defeats.

Buckland were denied at the death by **Millbrook**, conceding two minutes from time to become the final team to register a league draw this season. The Bucks looked set to add to their tally of eight league victories following a close-range finish from Rob Farkins at the back end of the opening half, but then with the final whistle in sight, Ryan Knight drew the hosts' level to maintain Millbrook's impressive recent run of results.
