WELLINGTON AFC Club History

Formed in 1892, we are proud to be an FA Accredited Club. Initially, the club played in leagues based around Taunton and Tiverton. In the early 1960s, we gained promotion to the Somerset Senior League and succeeded in achieving Western League status in 1978 which has been retained ever since, making us one of the league's longest continuously-serving members.

The First Team entered the Western League in the First Division in the 1978-79 season and played at Premier Division level from 1981-82 to 1984-85 and 2008-09 to 2010-11. The team were then promoted as First Division Champions at the end of the 2016-17 season. In their first season back in the Premier Division, the team finished a creditable 15th and also reached the semi-final of the Somerset Premier Cup losing 4-1 away to Southern League club Paulton Rovers. The following season, the team finished in 16th place but unfortunately, the next two campaigns were brought to an early conclusion by the Coronavirus pandemic.

Last season provided new challenges for the team, including starting the season with a trip to Mousehole and a final match at Helston on Easter Monday. The side achieved their highest position in the Toolstation Premier League since the 2009-10 season (14th) and equaled the club's longest run in the FA Vase (third round). The 2022-23 season again presents new challenges and new grounds to visit with teams being promoted to and relegated into the Premier Division. Joint managers Tim Legg and Alex Pope are again in charge of the side.

The Reserves were top of Division One West in the Devon and Exeter League when the 2020-21 season was terminated due to the Covid pandemic. The league took the opportunity to restructure for the start of the 2021-22 season and move away from the East and West Divisions and, as a result, the Reserves were placed in Division One where they finished in fifth place. Although there has been some movement of teams within the league the Reserves, under new manager, Nick Buttle, have remained in Division One for this season.

Having played in the Devon and Exeter League for a number of seasons, the A team transferred to Division Three of the Taunton Saturday League for the 2018-19 season when they finished a creditable third, gaining promotion to

Division Two for the 2019-20 season. They gained further promotion to Division One for the 2020-21 season and were topping the table when the season was forced to end due to the Covid pandemic. They won their group in the league's Covid Cup and also won the Seward Cup held over from 2019-20. Last season they finished in fifth place and, under manager Warren Toth, are in Division One again this for this campaign.

The club's Ladies played in the Somerset County Women's League Division Two (Flexi) in the 2020-21 season, finishing a creditable third when the season resumed. Last season they again played in Division Two where they finished in second place and reached the quarter-finals of the League Knock-Out Cup. Under manager Nyima Touray, they have been promoted to Division One for the 2022-23 campaign. This season there is also an additional Ladies Development Team, giving the opportunity for players to progress from the Wildcats Under 16s to senior football.

Last season, our youth teams once again performed well in their respective league and cup competitions, notably the Under 14s Town won their division and were runners-up in the league cup while the Under 12s United and Under 15s Town teams both finished runners-up in their division. All the other youth teams, boys and an increasing number of girls, acquitted themselves well and continue to be run by a small army of enthusiastic volunteers.

Our three Disability teams also performed well in their league and, this season, instead of three adult teams, we have two adult teams and a youth team.

In total this season, the club are running no fewer than 33 teams.

We continue to work with the town and district councils to pursue the club's attempts to establish a new First Team facility on land on the new Longforth Farm Estate on the edge of the town. This would then free-up the Playing Field for other teams to use. We are also working with the Wellington Sports Federation on the Somerset West and Taunton Playing Pitch Strategy regarding other land in the town where it is proposed a number of youth sports pitches would be provided.

Outside our core footballing activities, Wellington AFC is home to several darts and skittles teams and we run a full programme of social events for members and non-members alike with the impressive Function Room and Lounge available for hire.

LAST TIME OUT TORPOINT ATHLETIC 3 1 WELLINGTON

Wellington failed to build on an improved first-half performance as they went on to suffer their third successive league defeat in Cornwall last Saturday (March 18th)

It really was a game of two halves with the Tangerines bossing the opening 45 minutes, only for the tables to be turned after the break with the hosts hitting three goals in 11 minutes to take the points.

On their first trip to the impressive Torpoint setup, Wellington welcomed back keeper Harley Wilkinson and the three Quick brothers, who all missed the midweek defeat at Street. And they opted for a new-look back three with Tom Stone on the right, Jack Bown-Porter central and Jason Quick on the left. The extra man in midfield paid dividends in the first half with Torpoint showing little attacking intent and the visitors dominating possession.

Wellington almost went ahead after 25 minutes as Eli Collins saw a shot from outside the box hit the post but they were not to be denied and broke the deadlock two minutes later. A flowing move out of defence ended with Nathan Byrne sending over a cross from the left and Miles Quick dived in at the far post to net with a powerful header.

Eli Collins – whose twin brother Zeph made his first start – was also denied by a smart save as it remained 1-0 at half-time.

Torpoint shook things up at the break and looked like a different side as a result while Wellington lost the momentum they had built before the turnaround.

The hosts drew level after 57 minutes when the ball dropped to Gary Hird with the visitors appealing in vain for offside and he made room before shooting home across Wilkinson.


They then took the lead with another drive from inside the box – this time Ryan Richards scored after his first effort had been blocked. And the game was virtually over as a contest two minutes later when Curtis Damerell lobbed the ball goal-wards from nearly 40 yards and his ambitious effort dipped in below the bar.

Wellington nearly reduced the arrears on 71 minutes with Jake Quick's cross headed against his own bar by a Torpoint defender but that was the closest they came to getting back in the contest.

TODAY'S VISITORS MOUSEHOLE

We extend a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Mousehole for today's Toolstation League Premier Division game.

The club was founded in September 1922, so this season marks its centenary. A well-attended exhibition organised by the Mousehole Archive was held on the anniversary, displaying a huge collection of photographs, news items and memorabilia covering the whole period.

In summary, the significant milestones in the history of the First Team are:

In 1960, joined the Cornwall Combination League (after playing in local leagues since 1922/23), and moved as leaseholders to its present location, Trungle Parc, on reclaimed marshland on the rural outskirts of the village of Paul – still its present ground.

In 1976, won the CCL League Cup and the inter-League trophy (the Eveley Cup) played between the League Cup winners from the 'Combo' and the East Cornwall Premier League – this 'double' being the only silverware in 40+-years' continuous membership of the 'Combo'

In 1987, purchased the freehold of the site from the local Council and celebrated the occasion with a friendly match played against Manchester United managed by the recently appointed Alex Ferguson

In 2007, finished 'Combo' runners-up and joined the newly formed South West Peninsula League

In 2016, won the West Division (Step 7 of the National League System) and the Cornwall Charity Cup - repeating that Cup win in 2018

Since 2019, there have been significant advances both on and off the field, thanks to the management and coaching group of Jake Ash, Adam

Fletcher and Andy Graham and a Committee of 25 actively contributing members led by Chairman Deryk Heywood

In 2019, the First team gained promotion to the SWPL Premier Division (Step 6) and in 2021, they gained promotion to the Western League Premier Division (Step 5). They finished third in their first-ever Western League season, missing promotion to the Southern league by four points

DEVELOPMENT TEAM

In 2019, won the Cornwall Junior Cup

In 2020, changed its name from Reserves to Development Team, reflecting a more focussed strategy to provide a pathway for young local players through to the First Team

In 2020, joined the recently formed St Piran League (an NLS feeder league, formerly Step 7)

In 2021/22, promoted Development Team youngsters midfielder Charlie Willis and winger Jack Symons into the First Team squad where they made 25 First Team appearances between them in the club's first-ever Western League season

In the summer 2022, appointed Drew Symons (Manager) and Tim Hurrell (Assistant) from Falmouth United to move the development strategy forward, working closely with the First Team management and coaching group

Mousehole AFC also have

- A blossoming Women's Team, playing in the Cornwall Women's Football League; and
- A thriving Youth section comprising 13 teams across the age range.





EXTRACT FROM TOOLSTATION BULLETIN – 2ND APRIL 2023

Midweek Action: On a wet and windy Tuesday evening, only one game in the Premier Division managed to avoid postponement, Ashton & Backwell United salvaged a point at the death to deny Cadbury Heath a much-needed victory. The Heath did move off the bottom with this point, but it looked like the night would be much more fruitful for them when Callum Whooley struck at the beginning of the second half to add to Ali Boyer's early opener. That two-goal advantage soon became just one when Zak Ford struck for Ashton on the hour mark, and the home side then grabbed a share of the spoils in stoppage time when Joe Bishop found the back of the net.

The elements weren't great on Wednesday evening either, but the fixture at Raleigh Grove was given the go-ahead, with visitors **Clevedon** coming away with a tight 1-0 victory over **Sherborne**. In a game of relatively few opportunities, it was Archie Ferris who scored the visitors winning goal ten minutes into the second half, giving the Zebras plenty of motivation going into the sides' reverse fixture at the Hand Stadium in three days' time.

Weekend Action: With more weather-enforced postponements on Saturday afternoon, Mousehole moved within two points of top spot in the Premier Division thanks to a 2-0 win over Shepton Mallet.
