WELLINGTON AFC Club History

Formed in 1892, we are proud to be a three-star FA Accredited Club and run more than 30 teams, providing football for hundreds and men, women, boys and girls throughout the season.

Initially, the club played in leagues based around Taunton and Tiverton. In the early 1960s, we gained promotion to the Somerset Senior League and succeeded in achieving Western League status in 1978 which has been retained ever since, making us one of the league's longest continuously serving members.

Since entering entered the Western League in the First Division, we have played at Premier Division level from 1981-82 to 1984-85 and 2008-09 to 2010-11. The team were then promoted as First Division champions at the end of the 2016-17 season and have since remained in the Premier Division.

In their first season back in the Premier Division, the team finished a creditable 15th and also reached the semi-finals of the Somerset Premier Cup. The side, who ended up 15th in 2022-23, are now managed by Richard Cherry, assisted by long-serving defender Jack Bown-Porter.

We have four other senior sides - the Reserves in the Devon and Exeter League's Division One, the A team in the Taunton Saturday League's Division One and the Ladies, who have two teams in the Somerset County Women's League.

We run 23 teams in our youth and minis with both boys and girls playing from the age of eight right through to 18 - along with coaching for even younger children.

We also have a thriving Disability section with two adult sides and a youth team.

Off the pitch, Wellington AFC play a major role in the local community – we are home to a large number of skittles and darts teams and our social facilities are in use throughout the year for a wide range of events staged by local organisations, registered charities and individuals.

We extend a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of St Blazey for their first visit to the Playing Field which is also our first home game of the season.

As our supporters will be aware our season has opened with no fewer than nine matches away from home. THE SEASON SO FAR....

It's great to be back at the Playing Field today after our season opened with no fewer than nine matches away from home.

The summer was a transitional period for the first team after joint mangers Tim Legg and Alex Pope stepped down at the end of the 2022-23 campaign and a number of the squad moved on to pastures new – including three young players taking up football opportunities of the other side of the Atlantic.

Ex-professional Richard Cherry – part of the coaching team last season – has taken over as manager with long-serving defender Jack Bown-Porter as his assistant player-coach.

Together, they have worked tirelessly to assemble a new squad and all their efforts paid off with a magnificent 2-2 draw away to Helston Athletic on the opening day of the season.

The Cornish side – who have since gone on to top the table where they sit today – led 2-0 but we fought back brilliantly to draw 2-2 thanks to a goal from James Cottrill, one of the new signings, and a late penalty converted by Bown-Porter.

Unfortunately, we were unable to follow that up the following Tuesday as we went down 2-0 to Shepton Mallet before a battling Emirates FA Cup performance against Bideford from the Southern League ended in defeat by the same scoreline.

We were then dreadfully unlucky to come away from Torpoint Athletic empty handed as the hosts scored in injury time for a 2-1 win after substitute Rohan Poulsom had driven home our late equaliser.

Worse was to follow as we were beaten 3-0 away to league newcomers Nailsea and Tickenham – playing more than half with game with ten men after keeper Shay Allen was sent off – before a 4-0 defeat in the Isuzu FA Vase by Okehampton Argyle of the South West Peninsula League.

The squad finally picked up their second point of the season with a hardearned draw away to Ilfracombe Town where our scorer was Lewis Trusson, a new signing from Ilminster Town. But the past two games have ended up with two further defeats, going down 4-1 at Saltash United – where our goal was scored Douglas Camilo, on a brief return from Willand Rovers – before crashing 8-0 away to second-placed Falmouth Town last Saturday.

We travelled down to Cornwall with a much-changed line-up – a number of players were either injured or unavailable – and found ourselves 5-0 down at the break before conceding three more in the second half.

Let's hope it will be home sweet home today!

TODAY'S VISITORS ST BLAZEY

The club was formed in 1896 as a Junior club, by Dr E.S.S. Davis, a member of the Cornwall County Football Association. St Blazey won the Eastern Divisional Cup, Junior Cup, and Bodmin & District League Cup in 1909 and 1910 before it attained Senior status later that year. The club reached the final of the Cornwall Senior Cup twice in the early 1930s, finishing as runners-up on both occasions before winning the competition for the first time in 1936, along with the Cornwall Charity Cup, and Herald Cup to become the first club to win all three trophies in one season. St Blazey were a founder member of the South Western League in 1951, a league which they won thirteen times, including the 2001–02 season when they suffered no league defeats en-route to winning the trophy. The club achieved thirty-three victories, and three draws from thirty-six league matches that season, earning 102 points.

St Blazey are considered to be among the most successful clubs in Cornwall. Its first senior league title came in 1955 when the club became champions of the South Western League, a competition which they have won thirteen times in total, while they have finished as runners-up on another ten occasions. The club has also achieved considerable success in cup competitions, including the Cornwall Senior Cup, a competition which they first won in 1936. St Blazey have won the competition eleven times, with their most recent success coming in 2002. They have finished as runners-up on another ten occasions. The club's most recent success came in 2007 when they won the South Western League and the Cornwall Charity Cup.


The club's first silverware of note came in 1909, while it was still competing at Junior level, when St Blazey won the Cornwall Junior Cup. A competition it would win again the following year. The club has entered all but one edition of the FA Cup since 1950, and the FA Vase since 1984. They also competed in the FA Trophy during the 1970s. The club held a notable record following their unbeaten South Western League season in 2002. The club went 75 matches unbeaten in league competition, which was a record for English football at senior level until it was bettered two years later by AFC Wimbledon, who competed in the Isthmian League at the time.

EXTRACT FROM TOOLSTATION BULLETIN 10TH SEPTEMBER 2023



Falmouth Town really look to have hit their straps over the past couple of weeks, following up three recent wins with a thumping 8-0 victory at home to **Wellington**. The hosts were in control for the entirety of the fixture, storming into a three-goal lead after only 16 minutes courtesy of Tom Annear, Luke Brabyn and Alex Wharton. Town's Jacob Grange then added his name to the scoresheet before the half hour mark, with Brabyn striking again to make it 5-0 at the interval. Skipper James Ward got the ball rolling in the second half, before late goals from Jared Sims and Cam Hutchinson completed a near perfect afternoon for the home side.

Another home team to prevail by a wide scoring margin were **Bridgwater**, who recorded a 6-2 win over **Oldland.** Jack Thorne opened the scoring in the 21st minute before an Adam Wright header and a Tom Llewellyn volley put three goals between the sides at half-time. Thorne and Wright both added to their tallies after the break, with Jason Quick's 100th minute volley bringing the curtain down on a dominant victory.

St Blazey were the latest side to run up a big scoreline against early strugglers **Millbrook**, with Luke Cloke scoring a hat-trick to cap their 7-0 triumph. In the worst possible start for the away side, Ryan Downing took less than a minute to break the deadlock, before Cloke scored the first of his goals with a header after quarter of an hour. Jed Smale then headed home himself to extend the lead to three, before Cloke struck either side of the interval to complete his treble. Having only picked up their first league win of the season last weekend, St Blazey made it back-to-back, with goals in the final 20 minutes from Jordan Dingle and Aaron Dilley completing the magnificent seven.

Welton didn't quite hit seven themselves, but were only one short, with a trio of late goals helping them topple **Saltash** by six goals to one. The Ashes had shown signs of improvement over their recent run of games but found themselves facing defeat in the face once more with Dan Linham's quickfire brace putting Welton two goals to the good. A further goal in first half stoppage time from Will Hailston extended the home side's advantage, before Kieran O'Melia gave United feint hope when he pulled one back three minutes after the interval. 3-1 was how it remained for much of the second half, but Welton

really did come home with a wet sail and doubled their goal tally in the closing stages thanks to a Lewis Russell double and a Lewis Hunt stoppage time strike. In a much less one-sided fixture at Homers Heath, Phil Ormrod's masterful hattrick helped.

Street secure a 3-3 draw away at **Buckland**. Ormrod opened the scoring in Devon after only ten minutes, but Buckland were quick to respond with Teigan Rosenquest firing home. The home side were then given the opportunity to move ahead for the first time, but Jared Lewington's penalty was saved by Jason Hutchings, and the Cobblers made them pay soon after with Ormrod notching his second to make it 2-1. Buckland responded well again following the half-time break, and after levelling affairs courtesy of Ben Carter, they then moved into the lead for the first time with Josh Grant striking in the 65th minute. That was how it remained until the closing stages, before Ormrod stepped up once again, curling home a terrific set piece from 25 yards out to capture a share of the spoils for the Somerset side.

In a quieter game at the Hand Stadium, Alex Camm's deflected effort helped **Clevedon** edge to a 1-0 win over **Brixham**, while a Billy Tucker penalty and a goal late in the first half from Harry Foster saw **Barnstaple** secure a 2-0 an impressive 2-0 win away at **Nailsea & Tickenham**.

Another side to win well on their travels were **Torpoint**, with their 3-0 victory at **Ilfracombe** bringing an end to their five-match winless run. Owen Haslam was the first man to strike for Torpoint, scoring from just inside the area at the end of the first period. Torpoint then struck again at the beginning of the second half through Josh Pope, and after their hosts had been reduced to ten, a goal ten minutes from time courtesy of Ryan Smith confirmed the destination of the points.

Helston handed Shepton Mallet just their second defeat of the campaign, capitalising on an early red card to run out 5-1 victors. Mallet faced the worst possible start and were reduced to ten within the opening 100 seconds of the contest when keeper Tom Roberts was dismissed after hauling down an attacker who bared down on goal. Helston did eventually make the extra man count, going ahead after half an hour, but incredibly Mallet weren't behind for long with a long-range free kick from Charlie Bateson drawing them level. Eventually the dam broke however, and league leaders Helston surged home during the final 20 minutes, scoring four unanswered goals to register their fifth win from seven.
