WELLINGTON AFC Club History

Formed in 1892, we are proud to be a three-star FA Accredited Club and run more than 30 teams, providing football for hundreds of men, women, boys and girls throughout the season.

Initially, the club played in leagues based around Taunton and Tiverton. In the early 1960s, we gained promotion to the Somerset Senior League and succeeded in achieving Western League status in 1978 which has been retained ever since, making us one of the league's longest continuously serving members.

Since entering the Western League in the First Division, we have played at Premier Division level from 1981-82 to 1984-85 and 2008-09 to 2010-11. The team were then promoted as First Division champions at the end of the 2016-17 season and have since remained in the Premier Division.

In their first season back, the team finished a creditable 15th and also reached the semi-finals of the Somerset Premier Cup.

The side, who finished 15th in 2023-24, are now managed by Richard Cherry.

We have four other senior sides - the Reserves in the Devon and Exeter League's premier division, the A team in the Taunton Saturday League's premier division and the Ladies, who have two teams in the Somerset County Women's League.

We run 23 teams in our youth and minis with both boys and girls playing from the age of seven right through to 18 - along with coaching for even younger children.

We also have a thriving Disability section with two adult sides and two youth teams.

Off the pitch, Wellington AFC play a major role in the local community – we are home to a large number of skittles and darts teams and our social facilities are in use throughout the year for a wide range of events staged by local organisations, registered charities and individuals.

WELCOME TO TODAY'S GAME WELLINGTON v SIDMOUTH TOWN

We extend a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Sidmouth Town for this afternoon's FA Vase Second Qualifying Round game which is also our first Saturday home game of the 2024–25 season.

Our supporters will be aware that because of our ground share arrangements with Wellington Cricket Club, we are unable to play home fixtures here at the Playing Field until the second week in September. As a result, we must play all our early season matches away from home. This also means that, over the next few weeks, most of our games will be at home.

We were fortunate to receive a bye in the first round of the competition, while Sidmouth Town were drawn at home against fellow South West Peninsula League (East) team Torrington, winning the game 3-1.

If the match is drawn after 90 minutes, the result will be determined by penalties.

LIGHTS GO OUT ON TANGERINES

Our first team's return to the Playing Field on Wednesday night was foiled by a floodlight issue.

After 13 successive away games, we took on Barnstaple Town in the premier division of the Jewson Western League.

But after an hour of the match, which was delicately poised at 0-0, a problem with the lights on one side of the pitch meant the referee had to abandon proceedings.

The Tangerines had given a good account of themselves against a team bidding to go top of the table. The game will now be replayed on a date to be fixed.

Ironically, the club have submitted a planning application to install new floodlights at the ground.

MATCH REPORT

Western League Premier: Torpoint Athletic 2 Wellington 3

Wellington ended their frustrating run of defeats with a thrilling victory in Cornwall last Saturday.

The match began in dramatic fashion as Torpoint took a controversial early lead as they were awarded a penalty when skipper Luke Cloke went to ground and Harry Jeffery confidently converted the spot kick.

Wellington attempted to respond in the first half with Jake Quick seeing a goalbound effort blocked in the seventh minute and his brother Jason's low cross rolling agonisingly across the face of goal on the half-hour.

At the other end, Cloke came close to doubling Torpoint's lead on 38 minutes, rounding keeper Jake Viney only to see his shot roll against the far post.

Wellington then suffered a blow just before the break as Kieran Bailey limped off after being the victim of a nasty tackle, bringing Mark Cornish on as a substitute. They also lost Josh Lukins to injury seven minutes into the second half with Sam Gleeson taking his place.

Wellington equalised with 20 minutes remaining when Gleeson's cross sailed over the head of keeper Tyler Coombes and into the net.

However, their joy was short-lived as Torpoint regained the lead almost immediately, the unmarked Jeffery turning in his second of the game at the far post.

Manager Richard Cherry then introduced Phil Mendonca into the action, and it proved to be a pivotal move in the visitors turning the game around.

The diminutive youngster was denied by Coombes after a mazy run and then put Wellington ahead in the 85th minute after Harry Scott had nodded him into space in the box.

The visitors pressed for the winner, and it eventually arrived in the fifth minute of stoppage time, courtesy of a stunning individual effort by Mendonca.

He span away from a Torpoint defender before setting off on an electrifying run down the left and shooting low past Coombes to spark wild celebrations.

TODAY'S VISITORS SIDMOUTH TOWN

The first evidence of a football club in Sidmouth was in 1912 when a team known as the Sidmouth Unionists played in the East Devon League, but after just two seasons the First World War disrupted their progress.

In 1919 the team seems to have been reformed and played until 1922 possibly as the Sidmouth Imps when they joined the Ottery & District League for just one season.

They won that at the first time of asking so rejoined the East Devon League until 1928 when they switched across to the Victory League. One season and back to the East Devon League again and in 1931 became Junior 1 East champions.

In 1937 Sidmouth became champions again so retried their hand back in the Victory League until progress was again hampered by the intervention of World War 2.


After the war Sidmouth moved back to the East Devon League which was now known as the Exeter & District League, and in 1957 were promoted to the Premier division for the first time.

In 1968 Sidmouth won the Premier title for the first time but in the 1980s they found themselves back in Senior football on three occasions although they did win the Senior 1A title in 1987.

In the 1990-91 season, when three points were first awarded for a win, the Vikings were relegated but returned to Premier a year later despite only finishing eighth.

This is because the Devon & Exeter League as it had now become saw a number of its Premier teams transfer to the newly formed Devon League and had to change its constitution so clubs with better facilities such as Sidmouth were favoured.

Sidmouth were then in Premier until they won the championship for the second time in 2011, and then decided to step up into the South West Peninsula League which is where they currently operate.

HISTORY OF THE FA VASE



The FA Vase effectively replaced The FA Amateur Cup in 1974. In that year The FA Council had decided to abolish the official distinction between amateur and professional footballers, and this meant the end of the Amateur Cup and amateur internationals involving England.

Two hundred and twenty clubs entered the Vase in its first season, but they did not include those clubs which had dominated in the Amateur Cup. Enfield, Hendon, Dagenham, Skelmersdale United and others at their level were immediately allocated to the FA Trophy. For the first time in history, small clubs – even village clubs – had the chance of playing in a national final at Wembley.

The first Vase finalists were Hoddesdon Town from the Spartan League and Epsom & Ewell from the Surrey Senior League. The Hertfordshire side edged home 2-1 before a crowd of 9,000.



Even a competition as democratic as the Vase had its elite clubs in the early years. Billericay Town, initially of the Essex Senior League, won it three times in four seasons. Halesowen Town, then in the West Midlands Regional League, appeared in three Finals and were successful in two of them. They even beat a Southall side that had a young Les Ferdinand leading the attack.

Until the new Wembley opened in 2007 the record attendance for a Vase final was the 26,489 who saw the drawn 1989 final between Sudbury Town and Tamworth at the old Wembley. Tamworth won the replay 3-0 at Peterborough and Ian Moores, a former Division One player with Tottenham Hotspur, scored one of the goals.

The 2013-14 Vase competition was the 40th in history. Wembley has hosted 34 Finals, Villa Park and St Andrews two each, Upton Park and White Hart Lane one each.

Thirty-two different clubs have got their hands on the Vase, donated by former FA Councillor Frank Adams. Whitley Bay lead the way with four wins.

Aficionados of the Vase competition tend to rate the 1992 final between Wimborne Town and Guiseley as the best so far. Wessex League Wimborne had a modest record in the competition before then, having never ventured beyond the third round, but they embarked on a spectacular Vase journey which took them all the way from the first round to the final. A goal down after 14 minutes at Wembley, the Dorset side fought back to win 5-3. When the Vase final returned to Wembley, a record 36,232 fans saw Truro City beat AFC Totton 3-1. Whitley Bay, the 2002 winners, achieved a sensational hat-trick of final victories from 2009 to 2011. The Northern League's dominance continued for two more seasons, with success for Dunston UTS and Spennymoor Town but Sholing, the Wessex League champions, are now proud holders of the Vase.

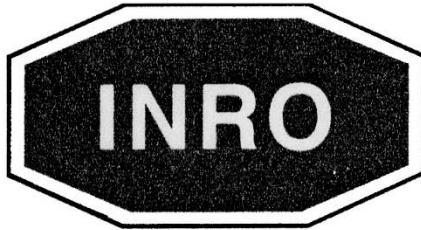

As an FA Accredited Club, we expect all spectators to play your part and support the FA's Respect Code of Conduct at all times

- Respect the referee's decisions even when you don't agree with them
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Appreciate good play whatever team it comes from
- Support positively. When players make a mistake offer them encouragement not criticism
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials
- Never engage in or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language
- Never engage in threatening or violent behaviour
- Stay behind the touchline and within the designated spectator's area

You must fully understand and readily accept that failure to comply with any of the above may result in you being:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Required to meet with the club committee, league or Welfare Officer
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Requested not to attend future games, be suspended or have your membership removed

In addition:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club
- Any physical assault on a Match Official will result in a lengthy or permanent exclusion from football and possibly a criminal prosecution
